# What Will Shelter Look Like This Fall?

Even before COVID was a thing, Severe Weather Shelter Network was challenged in several ways that had us thinking about how to restructure.

Overnight hosts were becoming harder to find. Volunteers were committed to their night and/or location.

Church vans were and are becoming a thing of the past making transportation a bit challenging.

When COVID caused us to close our shelter in March of 2020 we weren't sure how we were going to proceed.

As you all know, the last two shelter seasons SWSN has served through the motel voucher system. There were a few things we grieved:

- The loss of relationship
- The incredible expense
- The reduced engagement opportunities

By God's grace and mercy we are all beginning to emerge on the other side of COVID. SWSN is now beginning to implement a revised plan for providing shelter in church buildings.

What will it look like?

We will have one church building in each region to provide both the Warming and Host Site activities.

Each Warming/Host site will have a capacity of up to 40 individuals on any shelter night.

Service Provider partners and Outreach teams will be welcomed into the Warming Site hours to connect with guests for their immediate and on-going needs.

Volunteers will be welcomed into daylime roles during Warming Site hours and the familiar evening and overnight roles during Host Site hours.

Guests will be able to register for the season online and in person this season during scheduled Registration days.

Shelter days will allow registered guests to reserve their shelter space online, over the phone and in person this season. SWSN believes by moving to a regional shelter model we will be able to streamline the shelter experience for the guests, the volunteers, and our shelter staff.



One building in each Region gives SWSN a designated place for donation drop off and relationship connections over the course of the whole season.


